
Acute support when brain injury strikes



We all think 'it will never happen to me', but every year around 350,000 people in the UK are admitted to hospital with an acquired brain injury.





A brain injury can happen to anyone, at any time. When it does, we're here to help.

Headway – the brain injury association supports people affected by brain injury from the moment it strikes. This includes families whose loved ones are in intensive or critical care units.

At Headway, we recognise the need for families to receive support and information at the earliest possible stage.

The help we offer to families and patients in the acute stage of care includes:

 An <u>Emergency Fund</u> providing grants of up to £500 in the immediate aftermath of brain injury to help adult brain injury survivors and their families cope with the sudden practical implications
